Description: HYUNDAI IS INITIATING A NEW RECALL CAMPAIGN 203, A SAFETY RECALL TO ADDRESS A CONDITION INVOLVING ENGINE FAILURES RESULTING IN A VEHICLE STALL & OR FIRE IN CERTAIN MODEL YEAR 2019-2020 HYUNDAI ELANTRA, 2019-2021 HYUNDAI KONA, AND 2019-2021 HYUNDAI VELOSTER VEHICLES EQUIPPED WITH 2.0- LITER "NU" MPI ENGINES AND PRODUCED FOR SALE IN THE U.S. AND CANADA. HYUNDAI IS INITIATING THIS ACTION TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ITS VEHICLES.

THE ENGINES IN THE SUBJECT VEHICLES MAY HAVE BEEN ASSEMBLED USING PISTON OIL RINGS THAT WERE PRODUCED WITH INCONSISTENT NITRIDE HEAT TREATING BY THE PISTON OIL RING SUPPLIER RESULTING IN EXCESSIVE OIL RING HARDNESS. EXCESSIVE HARNESES CAN CAUSE CHIPPING OF THE PISTON OIL RING'S OUTER PERIPHERY, WHICH COULD LEAD TO ABNORMAL SCURFFING OF THE ENGINE'S CYLINDER BORE. A DAMAGED CYLINDER BORE COULD CREATE ACCELERATED OIL CONSUMPTION, WHICH MAY THEN CAUSE ABNORMAL KNOCKING NOISE FROM THE ENGINE AND/OR ILLUMINATION OF THE OIL PRESSURE WARNING LIGHT. CONTINUAL OPERATION OF THE VEHICLE IN THIS CONDITION COULD RESULT IN A SEIZED CONNECTING ROD BEARING, WHICH COULD CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE ENGINE BLOCK AND EVENTUALLY STALL THE VEHICLE. IN LIMITED INSTANCES, A CONNECTING ROD COULD PUNCTURE THE ENGINE BLOCK AND CAUSE ENGINE OIL TO LEAK, WHICH, IN THE PRESENCE OF HOT SURFACES, COULD INCREASE THERISK OF A FIRE. GIVEN THE NATURE OF THE PROBLEM, IT IS SAFE FOR CUSTOMERS TO CONTINUE PARKING INDOORS. THERE IS NO RISK FOR A FIRE WHILE THE VEHICLE IS OFF. OWNERS SHOULD PRIORITZE GETTING THE RECALL COMPLETED ONCE THEY ARE NOTIFIED.

Remedy: HYUNDAI MOTOR AMERICA WILL NOTIFY OWNERS OF AFFECTED VEHICLE TO RETURN THEIR VEHICLES TO THEIR DEALERS FOR AN ENGINE INSPECTION TEST TO DETERMINE THE PRESENCE OF DAMAGE ON THE CYLINDER BORE AND PISTON SKIRT. IF ABNORMALITIES RELATING TO DAMAGE IS FOUND, THE ENGINE WILL BE REPLACED WITH A NEW ONE. AS AN ADDED LEVEL OF PROTECTION, ALL AFFECTED VEHICLES WILL RECEIVE AN ENHANCED ENGINE CONTROL SOFTWARE UPDATE CONTAINING A NEW PISTON NOISE SENSING SYSTEM ("PNSS") PROGRAM. THE PNSS CONTINUOUSLY MONITORS ENGINE VIBRATIONS FOR UNUSUAL POTENTIALLY INDICATING AN ABNORMAL CONDITION WITH THE ENGINE, SUCH AS A DAMAGED CYLINDER BORE AND/OR PISTON SKIRT, WHICH COULD LEAD TO AN ENGINE FAILURE. THE PNSS IS CURRENTLY UNDER DEVELOPMENT AND WILL BE APPLIED WHEN AVAILABLE. THE REMEDY PROCEDURE WILL BE PERFORMED AT NO CHARGE. HYUNDAI WILL PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENT TO OWNERS FOR REPAIRS ACCORDING TO THE PLAN SUBMITTED TO NHTSA ON MAY 16, 2018.

CARFAX Glossary

CARFAX Well Maintained - Regular Oil Changes

CARFAX identifies a "Well Maintained - Regular Oil Change" vehicle as having a regular oil change history when all its recommended oil changes, based on the vehicle's maintenance schedule, have been reported to CARFAX. CARFAX uses the manufacturer's schedule and assumes normal driving conditions. Damage Indicator

Damage can be a result of many different types of events. Examples include contact with objects (other cars, trees, traffic signs, road debris, etc), vandalism, or weather-related events. Damage Severity

Damage events result in one of the following severity levels:

- Minor: Generally, minor damage is cosmetic (including dents or scratches), may only require reconditioning, and typically does not compromise a vehicle's operation and/or safety.
- Moderate: Moderate damage may affect multiple components of the vehicle and may impair the vehicle's operation and/or safety.
- Severe: Severe damage usually affects multiple components of the vehicle and is likely to compromise the vehicle's operation and/or safety.

CARFAX recommends getting a pre-purchase inspection at a certified collision repair facility.

First Owner

When the first owner(s) obtains a title from a Department of Motor Vehicles as proof of ownership.

Manufacturer Recall

Automobile manufacturers issue recall notices to inform owners of car defects that have come to the manufacturer's attention. Recalls also suggest improvements that can be made to improve the safety of a particular vehicle. Most manufacturer recalls can be repaired at no cost to you.

Ownership History

CARFAX defines an owner as an individual or business that possesses and uses a vehicle. Not all title transactions represent changes in ownership. To provide estimated number of owners, CARFAX proprietary technology analyzes all the events in a vehicle history. Estimated ownership is available for vehicles manufactured after 1991 and titled solely in the US including Puerto Rico. Dealers sometimes opt to take ownership of a vehicle and are required to in the following states: Maine, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania and South Dakota. Please consider this as you review a vehicle's estimated ownership history.

Salvage Title

A Salvage Title is issued on a vehicle damaged to the extent that the cost of repairing the vehicle exceeds approximately 75% of its pre-damage value. This damage threshold may vary by state. Some states treat Junk titles the same as Salvage but the majority use this title to indicate that a vehicle is not road worthy and cannot be titled again in that state. The following eleven states also use Salvage titles to identify stolen vehicles - AZ, FL, GA, IL, MD, MN, NJ, NM, NY, OK and OR.

Title Issued

A state issues a title to provide a vehicle owner with proof of ownership. Each title has a unique number. Each title or registration record on a CARFAX report does not necessarily indicate a change in ownership. In Canada, a registration and bill of sale are used as proof of ownership.

Total Loss Vehicle

An insurance or fleet company declares a vehicle a total loss when a claim exceeds approximately 75% of its pre-damage value or if the vehicle is stolen and not recovered. This damage threshold varies by company. These companies typically take possession and obtain the title. Not all total loss vehicles result in a DMV-reported branded title. This may occur when an insurance company's definition of a total loss is different than the state DMV's definition for a branded title or when the owner of the vehicle is a self-insured company, like a fleet or rental company.
